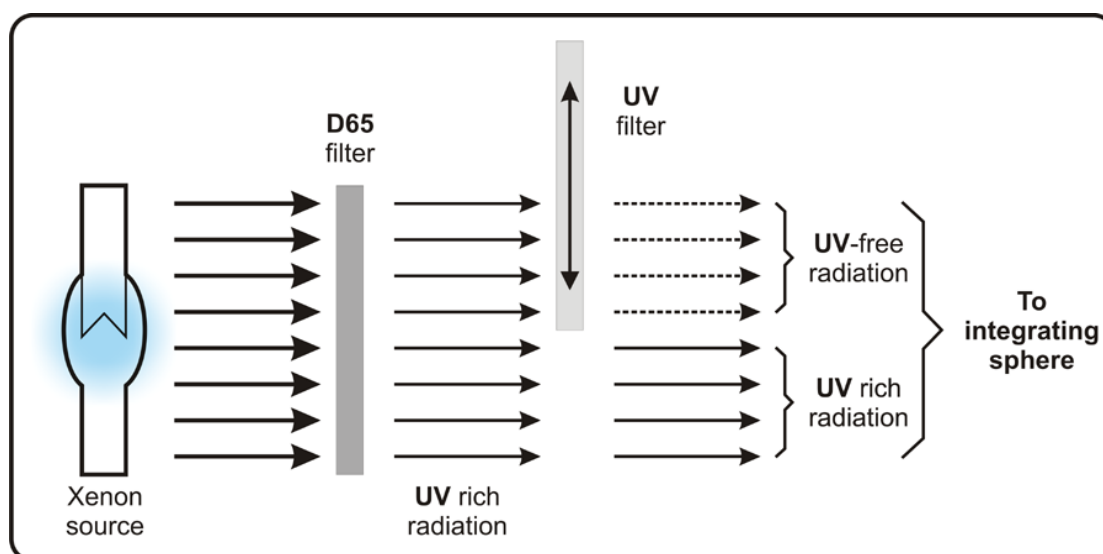


Figure 1 – Caption of Figure 1

References

For citations in the text please use Harvard style, i.e. state the first author or organization and the year of publication in brackets.

Minimum requirements for references:

For an article: Author's family name (capital letters), initials(s) of the first name(s). Year of publication. Title of the article. Name of the journal (*italic*), volume (and issue) number, page numbers.

Example:

ADRIAN, W. 1989. Visibility of Targets: Model for Calculation. *Lighting Res. Technol.*, 21, 181-188.

For a book: Author's family name (capital letters), initials(s) of the first name(s). Year of publication. Title of the book (*italic*) (Page numbers if necessary). City of publication: Name of the publisher (if known).

Example:

BOYCE, P.R. 2003. *Human Factors in Lighting, 2nd Ed.* New York: Taylor and Francis.

For an official publication of an organization: Initials of the organization. Year of publication Title of the publication (*italic*). City of publication: Name of the publisher (if known).

Example:

CIE 2010. CIE 191:2010. *Recommended System for Mesopic Photometry Based on Visual Performance.* Vienna: CIE.
