Image Rights

As part of CIE Tutorial on Monte Carlo Method for Uncertainty Analysis 2026 (Monte Carlo Tutorial), photographs and/or video recordings may be made by or on behalf of the CIE (International Commission on Illumination, ZVR 640982399) and the K-CIE (Korean National Committee of CIE), also referred to as local organizer. By registering for Monte Carlo Tutorial (or any part thereof), in the following referred to as CIE event, participants acknowledge that photographs and video material in which they are depicted may be used for reporting and marketing purposes of the K-CIE and the CIE (International Commission on Illumination), including their wholly owned subsidiaries and contractors to implement parts of the event, and may be published across various platforms, including social media, publications, websites and other media and formats.

By attending a CIE event, you agree that you may be identified on CIE recordings and publications. Specifically, the following rights under Austrian Law are transferred:

- Reproduction, exhibition, and distribution rights (§§ 16-18 UrhG)
- Broadcasting, lecture, performance, and presentation rights (§§ 19, 20 UrhG)
- Rights of reproduction via audio or visual media (§ 21 UrhG)
- Rights of reproduction of radio broadcasts (§ 22 UrhG)
- Additional rights under § 27 and § 54 UrhG.

If you do not wish to be included in such recordings, you may withdraw your participation or inform the photographer directly.

Furthermore, you may contact the CIE and the local host organization in writing at any time to object to recordings in which you are depicted. Upon receiving your objection, we will modify, delete, or cease further distribution of the images in question.

Registration, Payment and Cancellation Regulations

Registrations must be made using the Monte Carlo Tutorial registration system via the event webpage <https://reg.k-cie.org>. All payments must be wired to the account(s) stated on the Monte Carlo Tutorial invoices.

The registration system and regular registration procedures will close 17 days ahead of Monte Carlo Tutorial, thus by August 31, 2026. Any registrations thereafter (e.g.,

on-site) may require additional documentation (e.g., payment confirmations) from registrants on order to be able to access the conference.

Payments are due within 10 days and all payments must be received on the accounts stated on the invoice(s) by August 31, 2016 at the latest. Access to Monte Carlo Tutorial will only be granted to registered participants who have settled all dues as owned based on their registration information. On-site payments will be possible. Any open amounts (including from bank charges in the case of bank transfer) must be settled before receiving the name badge and entry allowance to Monte Carlo Tutorial.

Your registration for Monte Carlo Tutorial (and any singular events thereof) is binding and cannot be canceled without following the outlined procedures. Any cancellation must be notified in writing to the registration service at K-CIE using the email address: event@k-cie.org.

In the event of cancellation, the following deadlines and fees apply:

- Cancellation before the registration deadline (before or on August 31, 2026) – Cancellation fee of 10% of the invoice total, less any transaction charges and administrative charges (handling charge, disagio costs).
- Cancellation after the registration deadline (August 31, 2026) – Cancellation fee of 100% of the invoice total (no refund).

Any refunds will only be handled after the closing of Monte Carlo Tutorial. Please be aware that failure to adhere to the current access regulations on the day of the event will not entitle you to a free cancellation or refund of the registration fee.

With your registration, you authorize the local organizer to charge any occurring registration and/or cancellation and/or administrative fees to your credit card.

Registrations in special categories:

Participants registering under a reduced fee category (NC members, students) must be able to prove their status.

NC members will be asked to provide the 2026 CIE member discount code applicable to the CIE Webshop for publications. Students will be asked to provide a certificate of registration in a Master's or PhD programme at the time of registration.

If registered participants fail to demonstrate they fall into a specific category, CIE retains the right to cancel the registration and/or issue an invoice in another, applicable price category.

Handling of Registration Data and Data Protection

Only data necessary for the purpose of organizing Monte Carlo Tutorial as an official meeting of the CIE (International Commission on Illumination) is collected, used, stored, and processed.

The local organizer and the International Commission on Illumination (ZVR 640982399) are registered in Austria and South Korea and comply with the GDPR, 2026.

Regarding the collection and (computerized) processing of your personal data, please note that this is necessary for the organization full implementation of the CIE Tutorial on Monte Carlo Method for Uncertainty Analysis 2026 (Monte Carlo Tutorial) (including the publication of Conference Proceedings). Your personal information will only be shared with third parties directly involved in the event organization and only as required for logistical purposes.

Monte Carlo Tutorial registered participants agree that their data may be used, stored and processed to the extent necessary by the local organizer and the CIE, including any of their contractors, for the organization of Monte Carlo Tutorial, the management of membership/participation data in CIE events as well as other immediate purposes linked to Monte Carlo Tutorial (e.g. publication of basic participant information as submitted to the local organizer and/or the CIE in programs and publications).

In addition, all Workshop participants will be included in the CIE's database of interested contacts and registered on a CIE mailing list, which is primarily used for the distribution of the CIE quarterly newsletter. Participants may unsubscribe from this mailing list at any time.

For public purposes and in publications, the local organizer and the CIE reserve the right to publish full names and affiliations as well as any roles in relation to CIE or Monte Carlo Tutorial (e.g., Workshop Convenor, Prize Awardee, etc.) of all registered participants to Monte Carlo Tutorial and singular events thereof (in the case of presenting authors and speakers further information will be published, as submitted to the CIE or the local organizer.

All registration data submitted via the official registration system for Monte Carlo Tutorial is stored and hosted by K-CIE. K-CIE is responsible for ensuring the hosting environments' uptime, security, and privacy and provides compliance with relevant international standards and security frameworks, including PCI DSS, ensuring robust safeguards for stored data.

Participant's use of Monte Carlo Tutorial Conference materials and data

I undertake not to use event materials for commercial purposes, not to copy, not to publish event materials in printed publications, on the Internet, on television, not to distribute them in any other way, including for profit, not to transfer materials received from the CIE and/or the local organizer for the event in paper and electronic form to third parties, including for the purpose of copying and reproduction.
